



MISSION CRITICAL CHAPEL

PROJECT

We want to give this space new life fostering worship and ministry for the next four decades. We want to create an open and inviting space that accommodates worship services for up to 100 people, small weddings, funerals, and concerts. We also want to equip it with the latest technology for livestreaming, seminars, and larger studies and presentations.

We envision a beautiful, open and inviting space — filled with natural light. We anticipate adding strategically placed windows and indirect light — perhaps a reverse skylight that allows the hung cross to be illumined. Potential materials include stone and a fixed altar with views of the stained glass maximized. The back closets can be opened up for additional space and light. New flooring, a dedicated soundboard space, and recessed lighting will enhance the space. There is potential for a courtyard with a mural that defines an entry point into the chapel.



MISSION CRITICAL

PLAYGROUND

PROJECT


One of the greatest blessings we experience at TVLC is that our campus has been filled with kids, both on weekends and throughout the week. Our TVLC Preschool & Kindergarten has provided early childhood education from a Christian perspective for over 40 years.

We currently have 130 children in our preschool and kindergarten and a key need that has emerged is the updating and expanding of our playground. The main structure and support walls no longer meet current safety standards.

We envision expanding our current space with a play structure suitable for ages 2-12. We plan to have a new retainer wall for the sand area and a new exterior wall and wrought iron fencing that visibly opens the playground up to the north, blending in with our current landscaping and communicating to all who visit that children are welcome and valued at TVLC.







MISSION CRITICAL

EDUCATION BUILDING

PROJECT

Along with the playground, our education building serves as one of the main classroom areas for the preschool and has also functioned as a key venue for Sunday school and VBS activities. The building is 40 years old and has held up very well, but there are some areas that need attention. The room dividers, which are dated and solely used in the expanded position, would be removed and replaced with permanent walls in the current configuration. New flooring and a new drop ceiling would provide a greatly needed refresh to the space.

MISSION CRITICAL

ACCESSIBLE RESTROOM









PROJECT

The first pillar of our church's vision statement directs, informs and guides us towards an inclusive embrace to welcome all. Adjacent to the sanctuary restrooms, we have an opportunity to live into this vision through an underutilized kitchen area. Because we have two other commercial kitchens on campus, the space is largely used for storage.

This space provides the perfect location and footprint for a restroom to serve people with limited mobility, people who need assistance, and families. Repurposing the space would help us provide a welcoming and hospitable facility for all.

STRATEGIC GOAL

DEBT REDUCTION OR ELIMINATION

PROPOSAL

We view the four projects highlighted on the previous pages as mission critical projects — necessary to help prepare TVLC for the coming years of ministry. In addition, we have a strategic goal to reduce or, ideally, to eliminate our remaining mortgage debt to significantly increase our financial flexibility.

There is currently \$1 million remaining on our 30-year mortgage for the NFLC. It is due to be paid off in 7 years. Our current monthly payment is \$13,543 or \$162,516 annually.

The capital campaign we're proposing is 3 years in length and the balance on our debt would be \$650,000 at the conclusion of the campaign. Eliminating our debt at that time would save interest, open up the budget for additional ministry, and provide significant financial flexibility for us to navigate uncertainties.




ANALYSIS
