

Dear Friends in Christ,

This year our Grace upon Grace campaign completed the transformation of the Chapel into an intimate worship space with livestream capabilities. The next step is to refurbish our 40-year-old education building and work on the family restroom. In 2023, you have donated \$257,075, and since the start of the campaign, you have donated \$826,742. Thank you for your incredible generosity.

In April we had our annual congregational meeting and elected one new member, Toby Moore, to the Congregation Council. We had one person, Dave Swanson, who left Council. We are thankful for his leadership.

There were a few staff changes in 2023. Pastor Stephen and Annie Hilding left when Pastor Stephen accepted a call to become a lead pastor in Wisconsin. Vickie Denning agreed to return and resume the communications role. Veanne Lupia retired as Parish Administrator after almost 11 years of service.

We added 57 new members to our congregation this past year. Our baptized membership is now at 876. We have been averaging about 270 people at in-person services. Our choir and musicians do so much to enrich our worship experience!

Your generous support of our food ministry enabled us to provide bountiful holiday meals and extra groceries for 247 families at Easter, Thanksgiving and Christmas. Also 188 children received Christmas gifts. Our food bank provided emergency food bags for those in need as well as supplemental food baskets to Victory Outreach Tucson and to the refugee families we are sponsoring. The core food bank volunteers collected food from the Tucson community at large for the UA Campus Pantry to help those attending or working at University of Arizona to overcome food insecurity.

Household Blessings has done so well this year that it had to increase its storage space. With your help, the volunteers of this ministry, led by Donna Elmquist and Mari Eklund, have been able to provide kitchen/bath items, linens, furniture, clothing and other household items to those in need, including the refugee families we support. Household Blessings works with our ministry partners to supply New Home Starter Kits — the items necessary to set up a home.

After much hard work and prayer, the Call Committee members were very successful in recommending our new Associate Pastor—Amy Janssen. We all are looking forward to her joining our church leadership in 2024. A special thanks must be given to Pastor Josh for all of his hard work and dedication serving as the sole pastor for TVLC since Pastor Stephen left.

I hope in the following pages, you will rejoice in the desire our congregation has for following Jesus and sharing his love in our community and the world. If you have a passion for something you see in these pages or see the need for a ministry that inspires you, please reach out to a Council or Staff member to find your place within our community of faith.

Call Committee for Associate Pastor

Call Committee of eight TVLC members was elected at our Annual Meeting on April 23. The committee worked together the remainder of the year, evaluating five candidates for an Associate Pastor position. They conducted initial interviews with each candidate via Zoom. The committee found each candidate showed spiritual strengths and individual gifts, but four were not the right fit for TVLC. They moved forward with one candidate by reviewing sermons, conducting an in-person interview and checking references. Pastor Amy Janssen was recommended to the Congregation Council and the Council endorsed the recommendation on December 19. *Two Meet and Greets* were held on January 12, 2024 and a special congregational meeting was held January 14, 2024 to vote on the call. A call was extended to Pastor Amy and she joined TVLC at the end of February.

Dear Friends,

A s I look back on the past year of continued ministry, I am grateful for God's faithfulness and the ways the Spirit continues to be at work at TVLC.

In the spring, we said goodbye to Pastor Stephen and Annie Hilding after five years of faithful service. This led us into an interim time in which we were blessed to have Pastors George and Carol Karres, who are retired members of TVLC, step up and assist with preaching and pastoral care duties. I have greatly appreciated their hearts for service and the wisdom and inspiration they have offered us from the pulpit.

Thanks to the continued generosity of our congregation our *Grace Upon Grace* effort has continued to move forward. In August, we celebrated the grand opening and dedication of our renovated chapel space. Since then, it has been put to good use for our 10:30am service, midweek Advent services, student ministry, and

funerals. The bright, inviting space has served as a wonderful venue for worship and teaching. We look forward to the renovation of our education building in the summer of 2024 and the addition of an accessible sanctuary bathroom shortly after.

At the congregational meeting in April, we formed a call committee and entered into the call process for a new associate pastor. Throughout the process, we witnessed the realities of the clergy shortage in our greater church, and did our best to exercise patience as we waited for a candidate who we felt would be the right fit. In the fall we made contact with Pastor Amy Janssen for the first time and were struck by her authenticity, passion for the Gospel, and gifts for ministry. It turned out to be a great fit. We look forward to all she will bring to TVLC in the coming years.

In the fall we launched the "Life of Faith" initiative, which is centered on helping our congregants see ministry opportunities that exist in their everyday lives. Despite how it might sound, it is not a big program that requires us to do a whole lot of extra stuff. Rather it is a lens through which we look at all we do, and consider how we can incorporate ways to help people be more aware of and confident in the ways God desires to work through them in the various roles they take on each day.

For many churches, times of transition can be extremely difficult and lead to a decline and loss of momentum. Thanks to the faithful leadership of staff and volunteers, and the continued investment of the people of TVLC, we have continued to thrive in the past year. I rejoice in the ways we have been able to engage and welcome new people in our congregation, nurture and develop faith of all ages, and continue to make a real impact in the Tucson community and beyond. I look forward the ways the Spirit will continue to lead us, mold us, and stretch us as we seek to follow Jesus and share his love in the coming year.

Grace Upon Grace

hanks to the generosity of the TVLC family, our **Grace Upon Grace** campaign took a huge step forward in 2023.

In 2022, we identified four projects on our campus that are critical in helping us live into our vision to provide a welcoming, accessible and functional worship space; to provide safe and inviting spaces for our children and students; and to steward our resources to best navigate challenges and seize new opportunities for ministry.

A playground extension and update and the renovation of our chapel have been completed. In summer 2024, we plan to renovate the education building and move toward adding an accessible restroom in our sanctuary building. After that, we move to our strategic goal of eliminating debt.

- Our cost estimate for the four projects and debt elimination was \$1,250,000.
- We received pledges for the 3-year campaign totaling \$1,037,374.
- To date, we have received \$854,043 in pledges and additional gifts.
- We spent \$156,560 on the playground and \$285,789 on the chapel. We have paid \$22,800 toward debt reduction with gifts earmarked for that purpose.

We invite you to be a part of this exciting journey and unite with us to provide a firm foundation for the generations to come. Fulfilling your pledge allows us to have the funds on hand to continue work. Making a new pledge or giving to this campaign beyond your regular giving will provide the funds to meet all our goals. Thank you for your support. May we continue to follow Jesus and share his love.

Life of Faith

TVLC has been involved in the **Life of Faith** Initiative since the fall of 2022. Its purpose is to equip people to live out their faith in family, workplace, school, local community, and the world to recognize and affirm God's ministry that we are already doing in our daily roles and relationships.

In the spring of 2023, the TVLC Guiding Team met with initiative leaders, other participating congregations, and ELCA coaches to gather and share information to discern how to best connect faith at church and life in the world in our congregation. As a part of that effort, the Guiding Team surveyed TVLC Congregation to gather information about individual and collective faith practices in the congregation. The results were reviewed for baseline reference.

In the fall of 2023, the Guiding Team initiated a sermon series designed to highlight how our ministries happen both through our congregational activities and our daily lives. The series included two interview sermons with congregation members.

In 2024 the Guiding Team plans to invite as many parishioners, committees, study groups, and networks as possible to reflect and discuss what we mean when we talk about ministry in our daily lives.

What another wonderful year of growth for our Children's Ministry Program! 2023 brought many new faces, and our children grew both in their faith in Christ and relationships with one another. To kick off the new year, TVLC Kids collected gently used toys, books, and games. We partnered with the Household Blessings team and put together toy bags, for kids served by *More Than a Bed.* It was a wonderful morning of connecting and a chance for our kids to serve others. They also made valentines for residents of a memory care facility and continued to learn about the ways Jesus is working in our lives.

In the spring, families participated in a Family Night to foster community and develop relationships. Easter games and pizza were a hit

in March! A fantastic group of second graders took part in our First Communion Class and enjoyed making bread and learning the meaning of Holy Communion. In another Milestone Ministry class, third graders rocked out to the "Books of the Bible" and were received their first Bibles.

Summer brought our first Kids Camp, in which the Children's Ministry program teamed up with the TVLC Preschool to support and lead a three-week camp for kids 3 years – 5th grade in our community. Many church members participated in leading groups and helping with a sports program for our older kids. Families really enjoyed the program, and the kids had a lot of fun!

In the fall, we began a new curriculum for our younger children called *Simply Loved* and continued with *Be Bold* for our 3rd-5th graders. It has been wonderful to see our program growing, and God has helped provide extra volunteers and support for our classes. We kicked off "Student Sunday" the last Sunday of the month, in which third graders and older students volunteer to help lead in worship. Giving young people a role during the service, whether serving Communion or welcoming people to worship, has given them a purpose and helped foster a sense of place in our church family.

In October, kids and volunteers bagged over 100 pounds of dog food for local shelters during *God's Work. Our Hands.* Sunday. Church members decorated their trunks for our annual "Trunk or Treat" event, dressing up and passing out candy.

Christmas crept up quickly, and our kids stole the show in "A Super Christmas Story!" In true superhero style, over forty kids shared the good news of Christ's birth and sang their hearts out for all to enjoy. To also celebrate Christ's birthday, TVLC kids teamed up with Household Blessings Ministry to make birthday kits for children in foster care.

From our youngest kiddos to our middle school and high school helpers, we continue to learn about Jesus and grow in our faith together. We are TVLC!

During the first two quarters of 2023, Middle School Ministry continued weekly Zoom meetings for lessons. *Unplugged*, an in-person gathering, was held on the first Wednesday of each month and included a meal, service activity and worship. *Unplugged* gatherings hosted 20-30 students and families. We collected 64 pairs of socks for *Youth on Their Own (YOTO)* and created 50 encouraging messages for the young people served by YOTO.

In May, we celebrated 6 confirmands. We also celebrated 2 high school graduates, gifting them with blankets to remind them that the love of the congregation is always with them.

> n the fall, middle and high school student ministry kicked off with an orientation. Weekly middle school confirmation resumed in-person meetings with lessons about our faith and understanding more about reaffirming our baptism. We have had great attendance on the first Wednesday of the month hosting *Unplugged* with a meal, service activity and worship that includes communion. *Unplugged* nights averaged 20-40 students and family members.

> > In September, we made around 250-260 peanut butter sandwiches to serve the food insecure in our community through *Casa Maria Soup Kitchen*. We launched our prayer guardian campaign to connect our congregation to our students through intentional prayer for individual students at home. Our congregation is excited to see and meet our students in person. In November, we made thank you cards for our congregational veterans and handed them out personally during service. The

connection was well-received and the amount of gratitude from the veterans was overflowing.

Through God's guidance we have partnered with our TVLC Kids ministry to be engaged with our congregation by participating in worship services on Student Sunday, the last Sunday of each month. Overall we have had a successful third and fourth quarter with great engagement.

We have four high school students registered to attend the *ELCA Youth Gathering* in July 2024 in New Orleans, along with three chaperones and adult guides. We have many seeds planted and working through our students. God is rebuilding our high school ministry through each student one by one as our high school students are looking forward to reengaging more in the next few months.



Bible Study for All

Come Live in the Light was a Bible study led by Pastor Carol Karres in the spring. About 25 people were enrolled in the day and evening sessions. We studied Jesus' teaching in the Beatitudes which are part of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. This teaching emphasizes the blessings in our lives in times when we are humble, when we are calm, when we strive for simplicity and compassion for others. The latter is the story of Mary the Mother of Jesus, Elizabeth, and Ana the Prophet and set during the expected births of John the Baptist and Jesus. anque Verde Lutheran Preschool and Kindergarten is celebrating another successful year! Our school staff and the community that supports and loves our school is what makes us so special.

The Tanque Verde Lutheran Preschool/Kindergarten continues to provide classes for children ages 2-5 years old. Morning and afternoon enrichment classes are also available in addition to the regular classes for children who are 3-5 years of age. The enrichment classes accommodate the varying needs and schedules of our parents. Our Kindergarten class is an all-day program that accommodates 18 children. Most years all of the preschool and kindergarten classes are full.

Weekly chapel is still a blessing. We are able to take a little extra time each week to learn about God's love and show the children all that God has done for us. We are lucky to have a pastoral staff and school board that supports and blesses the kids with surprise guests for some of our chapels.

M embers and friends serve and make an impact at TVLC in a multitude of ways, often behind the scenes. Your skills are needed and we look forward to helping you find the right fit. Studies and Classes — Assist or lead Sunday School during the 9:15am service, Kid Central during the 10:30am service, summer opportunities for children, middle school confirmation mentors, and adult Bible and book studies.

Caring Friends — The TVLC Caring Friends ministry provides visitation and communion to homebound TVLC members. In addition to the pastors, the team consists of 5 members and regularly visits around 12 homebound individuals. **Pastor Josh**

Library & Gift Shop — TVLC's Library & Gift Shop serves our members, visitors, the TVLC Preschool and Kindergarten, and the community at large. We have over 7,800 titles for loan in the library's collection of fiction and nonfiction books, games, CDs and DVDs. 944 items were checked out in 2023. 

At TVLC — Communications · Personnel

The **Communications Team** works to build community by presenting clear, consistent and timely information about TVLC. We disperse messages about activities and opportunities using digital and print products including our weekly email newsletter, the Connect, our weekly worship bulletin, and other print products. We create content and manage our website (tvlc.org), worship slides, videos, social media, posters and street banners. We take photos and create graphics .We work to make the campus more welcoming to members and visitors by improving signage. We create print



products used in worship and by ministry groups. We work to optimize readership and outreach to best express our TVLC mission and ministries. In 2023, larger projects included stewardship materials, Call Committee materials, updated campus maps, exterior signage, Risk Management Evacuation maps and updated Connect layout and features including "We Are TVLC." The **Personnel Committee** oversees activities and functions that impact the employees of TVLC. This includes providing employees with a manual that explains the work parameters and condition of employment, ensuring salaries are competitive, and ensuring that the church is a safe and supportive environment for each employee to be successful. The committee monitors changes in state laws that affect employees.

Multiple positions became vacant during this calendar year.

- The Ministry Narrator position held by Annie Hilding became vacant when Pastor Stephen accepted a call to a church in Wisconsin. Annie was also filling in for the vacant Communications position. Vickie Denning agreed to return as Communications Director for an Interim period. Neither position has been filled on a permanent basis, awaiting the arrival of the new Associate Pastor.
- Timothy Ford resigned from his position and Hashem Zarei was made fulltime as Campus Care Coordinator.
- Erin Cowan resigned her position as Cross-Gen Ministry Coordinator. This position transitioned to a Student Ministry Position, currently held by Jayle Sinclair. Tara Hudson has a Children's Ministry Assistant on Sunday mornings to provide consistency and reliable help with Sunday School.
- There are some new faces filling the Livestream Technician position.
- The Parish Administrator position became vacant in September. Positions are reviewed when a vacancy occurs to meet changing needs. Volunteers were reinstated in the office to answer phones and greet visitors.

The committee recommended year-end bonuses for those employees who work in the office and did additional duties through the transitions of staff. Property Management & Botanical Team

The Property Management Committee tackled a lengthy list of improvement projects and tasks throughout the year to foster a beautiful and inviting campus. Many projects involved behind the scenes work, less visible, but no-less important, to maintain the functional backbone of our TVLC facility. Major highlights for the year are listed below.

- NFLC Roof Maintenance This long-term project included pressurewashing, wire-brushing and painting the roof parapets of the NFLC Café, classrooms and stage, as well as applying silicone sealant, fiber and mastic to roof vents where needed.
- NFLC Bathrooms Repainting the bathrooms, including removing and thoroughly cleaning air vents.
- Chapel Exterior Patching and painting the chapel exterior, including the preschool patio ceiling, in preparation for the chapel remodel dedication.
- Other Work Many additional smaller updates and improvements including replacing lights, grouting tile, installing new signs, painting light poles in the courtyard, replacing cooler bearings, patching roof leaks and grinding trip hazards.

The botanical team, as always, took excellent care of the church's wide assortment of desert plants and landscapes. This team worked tirelessly planting, watering, trimming, weeding, planning with our professional gardeners, and implementing many improvements to beautify the church grounds.

We are extremely grateful for the congregation at TVLC and the generous giving by our members who create and support such an inviting campus. We are blessed to have a dedicated Property Team to maintain it. It is an honor to be able to work around the campus and for our group to be able to accomplish all that we do. The group's efforts are visible throughout the church, and our desire remains to continuously improve our facilities and the experiences of all who use it. God's

he Risk Management team has continued to assess and evaluate potential risks to the TVLC campus and its visitors.

We've completed the traditional inspections for the fire alarm system, extinguishers, AED systems and first aid boxes. They are all functioning properly and are operational.

Evacuation floor plans have been placed near exit doors to identify critical items including fire extinguishers and phones as well as a way to egress the area.

The RM team continues to maintain close relationships with local fire, police and Sheriff's departments to ensure we are made aware of any concerns that may affect the TVLC campus.


Our team continues to review operations prior to major church events like our shredding event and Christmas and Easter services to see where issues may arise and what can be done to prevent them.

S tewardship Ministry is a call to serve and love our neighbors through a generous response to God's abundance with time, talent and treasure.

In fall 2023, we set aside some time to talk about generosity and think intentionally what our call to commit to supporting God's work at TVLC will look like in the coming year. The *open hearts open minds* emphasis considered how we can experience more of the joy and life that comes when we freely receive and freely give. We looked at how our relationship with money is a vital aspect of our spiritual health and how our giving is vital for the ministry we do together as a congregation.

Our General Fund can be divided into three large categories of expenditures. About 40% of it facilitates our worship services — pastors, musicians, support staff, resources and spaces. About 30% enables our CONNECT ministries where we come together to build relationships, grow in our faith and support and care for each other. We share about another 30% to serve our community and world through our greater church, ministry partners, and the facilities and staff to support our ministries.

The financial portion of the campaign culminated on November 11-12 with a celebration of food and fellowship — including a bounce house — and enjoyed the beautiful weather on the NFLC patio. 188 commitments were received totaling \$672,028. We are thankful for your continued response to support the mission and ministry of TVLC on our campus, community and the world.

Our TVLC family generously shares its time and talents in our many ministries. We invite new members to share their talents and interests so that we can best match them to our ministries. 

TVLC strives to make an impact by meeting evolving needs in our community and beyond, focusing on meaningful and effective relationships and partnerships.

Children's Christmas Gift Program — Our program works with the TVLC Food Ministry to identify children who might not otherwise receive gifts because of family crises. The families of infants through teenagers complete forms identifying gifts that will delight and



assist the children. TLVC members provide the wrapped gifts, which are added to the families' food boxes. In 2023, TVLC provided gifts for **188 children** through nine ministry partners. **Eileen Monahan, Catherine Davidson, Joanna Weise**

Community Baby Shower — The Community Baby Shower provided an opportunity for TVLC to support families served by *Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest* who are expecting a baby, recently gave birth or adopted an infant. In 2023, we provided 1,734 baby wipes, 598 diapers, 199 bibs, 43 baby blankets, 29 onesies, 18 burp cloths, 12 waterproof pads, 11 baby quilts and a highchair, Pack 'N Play, car seat, and other items including several bags of clothes and toys. **Sue Jensen**

Creation Care — The Creation Care team conducted its annual electronic recycling and paper shredding event, offered free to the Tucson community. **Over 200 vehicles** dropped off recycling during the event. This year, the



Pima County Sheriff's Department supplied the shredding trucks and trained volunteers for traffic control on Tanque Verde and the church parking lot. Electronics recycling was provided by Grumper Recycling. Scouts and adults from Boy Scout Troop 141 provided assistance. 16 TVLC volunteers welcomed people to our campus and unloaded cars. The TVLC Food Ministry accepted food and monetary donations. Creation Care also accepts printer cartridges in the church office for recycling. Approximately \$75 was earned last year. **Sue Jensen**

Food Ministry — The Food Ministry team continued its decadeslong service to the community. With the congregations' generous support, in 2023 they provided food for **75** families at Easter, **93** at



Thanksgiving, and 79 at Christmas. This year's holiday food bags were packed with donated canned goods, pantry staples, fresh food items and frozen meats.

Holiday food recipients are identified and food is distributed via their referring agencies: *Tucson Unified School District, Pima County Health Department* (Women's and Children Division), United Cerebral Palsy of Southern Arizona, Arizona Cancer Care Center, Veterans Southern Arizona Healthcare System, refugees, and members of the congregation.

Monthly food distributions were made to *Victory Outreach,* the *Southern Arizona Veterans* Homeless program, Sister José Women's Center and refugee families assisted by TVLC. The *UA Campus Pantry* was also provided food that was collected off



campus in community collection boxes. Donated expired foods that fall within approved guidelines were distributed to *Interfaith Community Services* and *Casa Maria*. A summer food collection was held for unhoused veterans with 2,450 various pull-top food items, snacks, pet food and treats, and water bottles donated.

God's Work. Our Hands. — TVLC's annual Days of Service took place on October 21, 22 and 29.

 On October 21, TVLC's Creation Care partnered with the Pima County Sheriff's Department and Grumper Recycling to offer a free electronic recycling and paper shredding event for our community. Over 200 vehicles dropped off recycling and filled 2 trucks with shredding and 6 bins and 2 pallets with electronics. TVLC Food Ministry received 700 pounds of food and \$624 in cash donations.

• On October 22, the Sunday School children and leaders filled over 400 bags with pet food for the pets of persons served by Sister José Women's Center and Casa Maria Free Kitchen. Another group of volunteers assembled 80 hygiene kits for clients of Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest and





Eagles Wings of Grace. A third group made 80 bags lunches for day workers living at the *Primavera Men's Shelter*.

• On October 29, a TVLC group served dinner to 261 guests at *Gospel Rescue Mission*.

We are thankful to everyone who contributed to the success of these projects and to *Thrivent* for providing Action Team funds to purchase supplies. **Sue Jensen**

Household Blessings— This ministry began in 2021 and has grown exponentially by "repurposing goods and

rebuilding lives." Household Blessings provides good quality, used household furnishings, clothing, and other needed items to individuals and families through partnerships they have formed with over 20 community agencies and organizations. They specialize in providing "Starter Kits," which include items needed to set up the kitchen, bath, and bedroom



in a home. The team accepts donations from the TVLC family before services on the first weekend of each month. They also receive donations from friends, family and neighbors of TVLC, from the TVLC Preschool & Kindergarten families, from other churches, and by gleaning other sales.

This year the ministry had had over 50 families shop at their storage garage to pick out items to set up their homes. They distributed birthday bags, pet food bags and personal hygiene bags that were made by the Sunday School students. They also received quilts from the TVLC Quilters. Working with the TVLC Food Ministry they donated food and a freezer to *Sister José Women's Center* and Thanksgiving food to *I Am You 360*. They also received

donations of cleaning products from the congregation to help young residents in a tiny home community of *I Am You 360*.

Interfaith Community Services (ICS) — TVLC has been a

ministry partner with ICS since 2012. ICS works with seniors, people with disabilities, and those facing financial crises, and those without sufficient food. In 2023, we collected more than 600 jars of peanut butter to their food bank. TVLC's Household

Knitters — The knitters are devoted to charity, education, companionship and fun. The group knits for a variety of charities including Project Linus which distributes handmade blankets to children who are seriously ill or injured, the Baby Hat ministry, sweaters and hats for students in the Navajo nation, and hats and shawls. They average 5-6 knitters weekly and 12 on their monthly Saturday gathering. They welcome all who knit or crochet, including those who want to learn. **Connie** Mallette



Lutheran Campus Ministry at UA — TVLC supports the UA Lutheran Campus Ministry (LCM) faith community as a part of our annual benevolence budget. Pastor Rebecca Boardman leads a group of about two dozen grad and undergrad students in a weekly evening worship and dinner and various serving and learning opportunities. TVLC members prepare the weekly meal for the students a couple of times each semester. Pastor Josh and Rick Kennedy represent TVLC on the LCM board. **Pastor Josh**

Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest — LSS-SW's mission is to assist individuals and families that are in crisis or transition. It provides services to the aging and disabled, refugees and immigrants, families and children as well as emergency services. LSS-SW is one of the organizations that is part of TVLC's annual benevolence budget. In addition to the congregation's benevolence pledge, our Food Ministry provided shelf-stable food for 4-5 LSS-SW families each month. TVLC also generously contributed items for LSS-SW's Community Baby Shower, School Supplies and Share the Warmth blanket and coat drive. A sewing machine was also donated for the refugee empowerment sewing lessons program. Doug Pearson,

Mobile Meals of Southern Arizona — Each Friday the TVLC delivery team delivers diet-specific meals to homebound patients. In 2023, the team delivered seven to nine meals each week. Each team member delivers once or twice monthly, developing relationships with those to whom they deliver. **Carol Paulsen**

Quilters — The Quilters serve the congregation and community with their skills. They gather twice monthly to work on projects together, but they also work independently.

• The Quilters made 15 pieced baby quilts, 34 flannel receiving blankets, 23 cotton receiving blankets, 3 burp

cloths and later additional bibs and tee shirts that were serged for Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest.

- They made 15 prayer pillows for children learning the Lord's Prayer as a part of *Milestones Ministry*.
- The group created 3 quilts for gifts of appreciation for departing TVLC employees, 5 quilts for hospital visits and 5 for hospice gifts.
- They added the name of the Chili Cook-Off winner to the apron they made last year.

• They made 3 baptismal quilts and bags.

The group has been self-supporting and raised \$800 by selling their creations at the TVLC Christmas Market. **Karen Yodice**

Refugee Ministry — The TVLC Food Ministry and Household Blessings ministry help support refugee families who are welcomed through *Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest.* To get involved with welcoming refugee families contact Doug Pearson who serves on the LSS-SW board. **Pastor Josh**

School Supplies — In July 2023, TVLC held a hugely successful school supplies drive receiving 156 backpacks, 106 spiral notebooks, 97 packs of notebook paper, 53 three-ring binders, 65 folders, and hundreds of other items. Supplies were donated to children in a refugee family, Wheeler Elementary School, Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest and Emerge Center Against Domestic Abuse. Students received new backpacks, ruled paper, notebooks, pencils, pens, markers, crayons, highlighters, glue sticks, scissors, and other assorted items. Classroom teachers also received supplies including copy paper, hand sanitizer, wipes, and tissues. The Wheeler Elementary School nurse was given a box of new children's clothing — underwear, pants, and socks — for children in need at the school. An Amazon wish list created by Jennifer Howerton was a new addition to the program this year and was very helpful for TVLC members and friends. Sue Jensen



Share the Warmth — During December, TVLC members donated 8 comforters and 15 blankets for older adults served by Lutheran Social Services of the Southwest. 33 jackets for vulnerable children and youth were also donated. Susan Fissell



Baby Hats — A clean, warm and dry head covering at birth is life saving for every newborn baby. Baby hats are used for home births, for emergency births and for hospital births. Whatever the situation, the hat prevents loss of body temperature and helps the baby adjust to the

environment. In 2023, one thousand baby hats were sent to Nigeria, 500 to Pakistan for use in an area suffering from floods, 500 to Guatemala, and 800 to Global Health Ministries for birth kits sent to 13 countries around the world. Over the past 16 years, this ministry has provided 48,495 baby hats to babies and young children around the world!



Baby hats are made or purchased by TVLC members and friends, including the TVLC Knitters, and from other congregations and individuals across Tucson and the country. Gods work being done by your hands. Each hat received from you is a life-saving blessing happening time and time again! **Sandy Buffington**

Haiti Ministry — TVLC has an ongoing relationship with

Village of Hope School and Medical Clinic, located near Port au Prince, Haiti. Due to increased violence and instability, we have been unable to travel and be the hands-on presence we would like to be for the children and staff. We sent a gift of \$3,000 from our Haiti fund in January 2024.



We also recycle aluminum cans on campus to add an

additional source of income for the ministry. In 2023, we recycled 934 pounds of aluminum, resulting in \$654.17. In addition, 35,000 pop tabs were donated to the *Ronald McDonald House* to allay the living expenses for families that stem from a child's illness. **Pastor Josh & Ralph Lucht**

BUSINESS OPERATIONS

Operational Support

t is the responsibility of Operational Support to oversee Tanque Verde Lutheran Church's (TVLC) finances, facilities, and communications so we have an infrastructure in place to support the various ministries of TVLC. This work is accomplished by not only TVLC staff and contractors, but also numerous church volunteers. Business operations include staffing, HR support, and daily oversight of the campus as a whole.



FINANCES

In 2023, TVLC's generous congregation enabled numerous ministries on campus, in our community and abroad. Our operational support role for finances is to manage our cash flow, pay our bills, and provide timely and accurate reports to the TVLC Treasurer, Congregation Council, and congregation.

TVLC financial business was accomplished primarily through our bookkeeper, Brenda Jordan, myself, along with oversight and guidance from our church treasurer, Ed Hudson. Pat Williams coordinated our stock donations. A faithful core team of offering counters (Phoebe Coleman, Ralph & Sue Jensen, Carol Maynard, Carol Paulsen, and Patty Pearson) came in every week to count and process weekly contributions.

FACILITIES

The operational support role for facilities is to ensure maintenance and required repairs are performed in a timely manner, and to oversee upgrade projects. Although some remediation work was required, we successfully passed all state and county required facility inspections.

I had the privilege of working with Ralph Lucht and the Property Management Committee (PMC) that he chairs, on numerous projects and improvements in 2023. The PMC is comprised of people with a wide range of skills that enable us to perform some facility repairs and maintenance with volunteer labor which saves us money. Volunteers worked side-by-side on numerous painting, roofing, fencing, plumbing, and shade sail projects. Both Charlotte Cordes and Curt Peters put in countless hours keeping our campus landscape well-manicured. New plants and trees were introduced around our campus, along with irrigation as necessary.

In 2023 we had a couple of major facility and campus upgrades.

- We provided the Preschool and the Household Blessings ministry with dedicated storage solutions on the north side of our property.
- Through our *Grace Upon Grace* campaign, we were able to completely remodel our Chapel and school playground.

I'm thankful for TVLC's Risk Management Team that is chaired by Karl Deutsch. That team consists of volunteers with varied backgrounds in everything from law enforcement and emergency services to business and marketing. The

diverse experience of that team creates a well-rounded approach to our campus safety and security needs.

Our campus facilities serve our church directly as we use them for worship services, Sunday School, student gatherings, cross-generational events, knitters, quilters, library, various group meetings, Bible studies, and business operations. Our facilities also serve as an outreach to hundreds of people within our community since we host numerous groups. Those groups included Boy Scout Troop 141, Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts, HOA groups, Lifeline, bridge tournaments, basketball, volleyball, and soccer for preschoolers. Our NFLC commercial kitchen was used throughout the year as a commissary for several mobile food units and one catering company.

TVLC business controls also cover our Columbarium which is located on the Northeast section of our property. We have two groups of niches that are offered to TVLC members and immediate family members. One is housed in a structure shaped like a cross, and the other is a wall.

COMMUNICATIONS

We communicate TVLC activities and events through our weekly bulletins, electronic newsletter, posters, banners, brochures, emails, Facebook, TVLC website, and verbal/visual announcements during services.

Our campus wide communications and business activities rely heavily on our internal LAN. Don Denning provides on-going hardware and software support, and problem resolution. Don works fulltime yet makes the time to help our church on an ongoing basis as a volunteer.
